Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am writing to you in the hope of getting your assistance in promoting and growing Canada's only EMS Museum. As you may be aware, the SWO Ambulance & EMS Museum is located on and is part of the Canadian Transportation Museum and Heritage Village (www.ctmhv.com), situated on a 100 acre site within the Municipality of the Town of Essex. Funding for the EMS Museum building and a significant portion of its contents were donated by Len Langlois, owner of the former Chatham & District Ambulance Service. CTMHV operates with little government funding. It has a small paid staff and a strong core of volunteers. They must raise over \$400,000.00 annually over any government funding to keep the doors of the entire operation open. To do so they operate a diner, give Transportation Museum and Village tours, have an annual car raffle, host cruise ins, car shows, flea markets, gun shows, auctions, wedding receptions and private parties. CTMHV even has an historic church on site which can be rented for weddings. However, at the end of the day we must depend on financial donations to carry out projects over and above day to day operations.

The EMS Museum is currently busting at the seams and we have little space to display newly donated items, let alone a significant number of items in storage. There currently approximately 2,000 square feet (40 X 50 with 16 ft ceilings) that is unfinished, which we need to finish, and currently this is the EMS Museum's foremost need.
